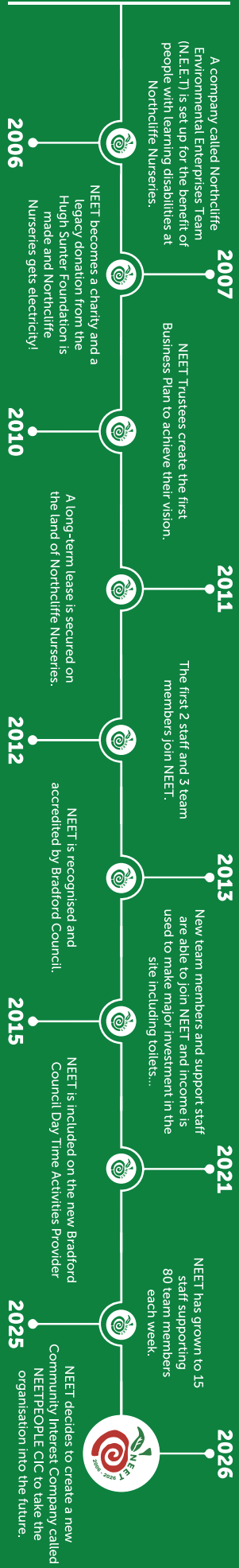

NEET grows

The life of a plant at NEETPEOPLE

Follow the journey of a plant from seed to sale! It is a long process and the NEET team treat each stage with care.



orderi ng

The journey begins with choosing the right seeds or young plants. The NEET Grows team create a growing list mixing much-loved regulars with new varieties.



collecti ng

The team collects the plants and prepares them for the next stage. This part of the process is time-sensitive, as the tiny plug plants – sometimes 360 to 480 in a single tray – need to be potted on very soon after they arrive.



Potti ng on

Young plants are moved into larger pots to give their roots space to grow. This includes fresh compost, careful handling, and the right pot size.



labelli ng

Labels are created on site, each plant is labelled clearly with its name, variety, and any care instructions.



deadhead & mai ntenance

As the plant grows, it needs regular care. This includes removing dead flowers, trimming damaged leaves and keeping the plant tidy and healthy.



wateri ng

Consistent watering keeps the plant thriving. Team Members check moisture levels and water according to each plant's needs—never too much, never too little.



rotati ng

Plants are rotated regularly to ensure even growth.

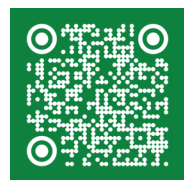


SELLi ng & deli veri ng

Once the plant is strong and healthy, it's ready for the next step. Customers can come and buy on-site, and we also deliver plants throughout Bradford. Of course we grow plenty for ourselves – fresh cut flowers, plants to fill our borders and planters, and lots of vegetables that we use in our cooking sessions.

NEET grows

Fruit Grafting

We recently welcomed a company called Fruitworks, who delivered a fruit grafting course in the potting shed. During the session, we learned how to graft and create new fruit trees, by the end we had produced 30 young trees ready to grow on. Across two sessions 14 team members got hands on with grafting, writing labels and potting on!



We will nurture these trees and sell them on in the future.



Seed Sowing

The NEET Grows team have expanded our seed-sowing programme this year by successfully using seeds collected from last season's plants. We're already seeing excellent results, with calendula, sweet peas and cornflower, all of which have germinated strongly and are growing on well.

To complement this year's seed sowing, Cathy is trialling compost mixes made with coconut fibres, vermiculite, and several peat-free brands. She is monitoring both germination and early growth rates of each mix to see which is most successful.



Seed Snails

Seed snails have been popping up all over the internet this year, so we decided to give them a try! They're a great space-saving way to start seeds, we made ours using recycled materials like old compost bags. The results have been impressive - Cathy sowed carrots on the same day in cell trays and a seed snail, the seedlings grown in the seed snail developed much stronger roots and better top growth. It's definitely something we will continue to experiment with on site.

Creating a Kokedama



Holly has recently taught herself — and the some of her growing team, the art of Kokedama. These are soil based, moss wrapped plants that originate from Japan. We've hung our new Kokedama in the window of the Zen Den, where they bring a sense of calm to this lovely space. There are plans to create a hanging sculpture using this technique too.

Creative projects

Our NEET Makes team have had a fantastic start to the year with hands-on learning, new creative projects and of course lots of fun! With our Spring Fair approaching at the end of May, the team has already begun crafting items for sale.

We have been making beautiful seed paper using wildflower seeds and recycled wastepaper. They have been drying in the sun and are now ready to be used. When the paper is planted in a pot of soil, the seeds grow and the paper composts away.



To complement our growing and plant sales, the team have created vibrant, herb markers using acrylic paint, perfect for identifying herbs in the garden. These handmade pieces will soon make their way into our on-site shop, where Team Members sell their creations.

NHS Programme

Our Thursday kitchen group has been exploring healthy lifestyles for a while now, and we're happy to share that we've been selected to take part in an onsite pilot of the Learning Disabilities Healthy Lifestyle Training — the first of its kind with Bradford Council.

As part of this pilot, NHS clinical dietitians will be working alongside our team covering accessible, easy to follow sessions on heart health, staying strong, managing sugar, understanding portion sizes, and food shopping skills.



New chef at NEET!

In January, we welcomed a new chef tutor, Chris, to the NEET Eats team. He and the group have launched a fantastic project exploring global cuisines through an "around the world" theme. Each week, we pick a country out of a hat, find it on the world map, and choose dishes to cook inspired by its culture. Chris loves weaving in as much learning as possible, so alongside the cooking, the team has been watching documentaries and exploring traditions of each place.



"I joined the team back in February and have been running a regular session with our Wednesday NEET Eats group.

Over the weeks, each team member has blossomed, and together we've found a rhythm in the kitchen. It's been fantastic to share my knowledge and watch their confidence grow as they experiment with new skills; suggest dishes they'd like to try and bring their own ideas to the table.

Not every recipe has been a hit, but every session has been full of learning and laughter as we cook and eat together, exploring new flavours, ingredients and cultures.

Now that spring is here, nature's larder is opening up even more opportunities for us to create. The highlight for me is seeing full stomachs, happy faces and a team that continues to flourish. I'm truly grateful to be getting to know such amazing people at NEET." - Chris

We recently donated winter bedding plants to the Kirkgate Centre in Shipley and Bowling Community Orchard.

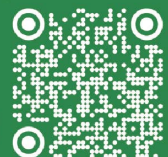
NEET on Look North
